6.a. Permit Parking on Fair Ranch Road (From Cabello Street to Alvarado Blvd.); Tumbleweed Court; Sunflower Court; Trailway Drive; and Duchess Drive (From Fair Ranch Road to end of Cul De Sac)

City Engineer Thomas Ruark presented the staff report and responded to question from Council. Staff did not recommend that a 24-hour, 7-day a week permit parking restriction be installed in this area due to the restriction of the neighboring apartment complex residents from legally parking in this area.

Mayor Dutra-Vernaci opened the public hearing and called for public comment. Being none, Mayor Dutra-Vernaci closed the public hearing.

Council concurred with staff recommendation and requested staff conduct a city-wide study for a city-wide solution.

It was moved by Councilmember Duncan and seconded by Mayor Dutra-Vernaci to deny the request for Permit Parking on Fair Ranch Road (From Cabello Street to Alvarado Blvd.); Tumbleweed Court; Sunflower Court; Trailway Drive; and Duchess Drive (From Fair Ranch Road to end of Cul De Sac); and conduct a citywide study on possible citywide parking programs. Alameda County Mayors Conference – Mayor Dutra-Vernaci attended the meeting on March 8 in Livermore where Dr. J. Patrick Kennedy, CEO and Founder of OSIsoft, LLC gave a presentation on dark fiber. Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) - Mayor Dutra-Vernaci stated a meeting with ACTC was tentatively scheduled for April 13 to discuss the rising costs of the East-West Connector project. Conversations have begun on cost savings measures as well.

Dumbarton Rail Corridor Policy Advisory Committee – Mayor Dutra-Vernaci reported on a meeting held in Union City, with staff, San Mateo County Supervisor/MTC member Warren Slocum, a representatives from the office of MTC member and BART Director Nick Josefowitz and SPUR Regional Planning were in attendance. It was reported that the Dumbarton Corridor study will not be available until August, which complicates things for Regional Measure 3.
