

**RESOLUTION NO. XXXX-18**

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNION CITY  
DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION  
HELD NOVEMBER 6, 2018**

**WHEREAS**, there was held in the City of Union City on the sixth day of November 2018, a General Municipal Election; and

**WHEREAS**, the Alameda County Registrar of Voters was requested to perform all necessary election procedures for the General Municipal Election; and

**WHEREAS**, the Alameda County Registrar of Voters did canvass the returns of said consolidated municipal election, and did certify to this City Council the results of the votes cast at said election, which said certification is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is required to pass a Resolution reciting the facts of the election and other matters as hereinafter set forth.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Union City does find and state as follows:

- A. Said canvass by the Registrar of Voters of Alameda County, as shown by said certificates, and the results of said General Municipal Election, are hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and declared.
- B. The offices to be filled by such General Municipal Election were for three (3) Councilmembers, with terms expiring in November 2022.
- C. The names of persons voted for, and the office for which they received votes, are as follows:

- D. At said General Municipal Election, the following ballot measures were submitted to the voters of the City of Union City, and the number of votes cast for and against said measures were as follows:

<b>MEASURE DD:</b> To maintain/enhance essential city services including 911 dispatch/neighborhood police patrols/emergency response times; after-school programs for children/teens; keeping fire stations open full time; and other essential services shall a measure be adopted establishing a Union City cannabis business tax at a maximum rate of \$12.00 per square foot for cultivation and 6% of gross receipts for others, until ended by voters, providing \$1,400,000 annually, requiring oversight and no money for Sacramento?	YES: 15,125  NO: 5,116
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<b>MEASURE EE:</b> To enhance local control with funding that cannot be taken by the State for essential services including fire/police protection; youth violence/gang prevention programs; maintaining city parks/senior services; and other essential services; shall a measure be adopted establishing Union City as a Charter City and a real property transfer tax of \$10 per \$1,000, until ended by voters, paid only by property buyers/sellers, providing \$5,000,000 dollars annually, with funds benefiting Union City?	YES: 9,260  NO: 10,785
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- E. The total number of ballots cast in the City of Union City at the General Municipal Election was 21,381 (58.93% turnout), and the total number of votes given in each precinct of the City of Union City was and is set forth in said canvass by the Registrar of Voters of Alameda County, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED** by the City Council of the City of Union City, that the persons hereinafter listed received the highest number of votes for Councilmember of the City Council, and that said persons are hereby declared to be elected to serve as Councilmembers of City Council of the City of Union City for a four year term:

Accordingly, the City Clerk is hereby authorized to sign and deliver thereto Certificates of Election, and to administer the Oath of Office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED** by the City Council of the City of Union City that since Measure DD is a proposed ordinance for the establishment of a Cannabis Business Tax, which required the vote of a simple majority of voters to be effective, and since this Resolution declares that a simple majority of the voters voting on Measure DD did vote in its favor, the proposed Ordinance is hereby deemed introduced and adopted as **Ordinance No. 854-18**, in accordance with the vote of the People, and shall become effective ten (10) days after the City Council certifies the results of the election, to-wit: December 21, 2018.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Clerk is hereby directed to attach a copy of this Resolution to the minutes of the meeting and make it a part of such minutes.
