Background

- City Council provided direction on 10/22
- Staff will present ballot measure ordinance and resolution for consideration on 11/26
 - \$175 base rate for a common parcel
 - Indexed to CPI not less than 3%
 - 8 year term
 - City Council places the measures; Voters will decide



Staff Finding

- \$175 base rate is where tax rate would have been in FY 21/22 if indexed to CPI
- \$175 will provide two more police officers equal to 26 extra patrol shifts a month
- 8 year term provides more fiscal stability
- \$175 tax rate in conjunction with other fiscal strategies needed to implement Strategic Plan Goal A, Strategy 1 to achieve fiscal stability and sustainability



Impact of Inflation



Measure UU in 2008:

- Rate increased from \$106.30 to \$125.64, a 16% increase
- 8-year term
- 2% limit on escalation

Measure QQ in 2016:

- Continued Measure UU rate
- 4-year term



Impact of Inflation



Tax Rate if Parcel Tax Indexed to CPI since 2008: \$174.74 in FY 20/21

Declining Police Department Staffing

- 81 sworn officers FY
 08/09
- 77 sworn officers FY 19/20





Tax Rate Needed to Fund Additional Police Officers

One Officer

- \$167/year
- \$1 a month above existing 20/21 tax rate

Two Officers

- \$175/year
- \$1.42 a month above 21/22 tax rate if existing rate continues



Additional Funding to Meet City Council Priorities

 Build strong connections with community partners, residents and employees.





Fiscal Impact

- Ordinance being prepared by City Attorney will generate:
 - \$5 million FY 21/22
 - \$6.2 million FY 28/29
- Funding for Police, Fire and Youth and Family Services
